- 1. The meeting was presided over by the Chairperson, Prof. George Mathew. P, Principal, and started at 2.45 pm with a silent prayer.
- 2. Dr.Tomy Joseph, IQAC Co-ordinator welcomed the members. In his speech he enunciated the need for inter-departmental co-ordination.
- 3. In his Presidential address, Prof. George Mathew P, Principal expressed his concern on the inadequate utilization of college infrastructure. He also expressed his views on the need of joint effort in realising future goals.
- 4. Prof. Tharsius Joseph, the eternal expert to the meeting spoke on diverse issues relating to the improvement of the academic environment of the college. His suggestions include:
  - Establishment of a research centre, especially with the PG Dept. of Commerce
  - Focusing on short term best practices with a potential of later development
  - Gaining an ISO certification
  - Initiating the Institutional Social Responsibility (ISR)
  - Starting new add-on courses to bridge the curriculum gap
  - To convert the College Alumni, a registered entity
  - Engage with the new platforms, associations, enterprises outside the campus to start new academic linkages and courses.
- 5. Dr.Padmakumar, the external expert opined that the Institution should focus more of the Teaching, Research and Extension aspects. A situation has reached where all the teachers have to be real role models before the students, he added. Through the initiation of Externally Aided Projects (EAPs) and Linkage/Networked Projects, the constraint of fund could be overcome. He projected the potential of the discipline Aquaculture and suggested for a network plan with other colleges in the Northern Kuttanadu belt like St. Aloysius, Edathuva and S.N College, Kumarakom. The need to conduct Expert Interface Colloquiums, Publications in Peer Reviewed Journals, setting up of Consultancy services, start-ups in the field of Aqua-culture etc. were some of his recommendations.
- 6. Sri. Syril C Kunnumpuram said about some of the deficiencies of the college which are to be rectified. The absence of a good college hostel, better conveyance facilities, more public oriented services (eg.Gym), Campus beautification and cleaning etc. were some of his suggestions.

- 7. Sri. K.V George demanded the need for more resources to the college library including more computers, books and Journals and display racks etc.
- 8. Sri. P.C Ravisankar suggested the need of inducing more ICT oriented methods in teaching and learning practices. Commencement of new courses and an efficient sewage treatment system were some other points to ponder with.
- 9. Dr.Gimson D Parambil suggested that there should be more add-on courses in Commerce and other vocational disciplines.
- 10. Lt. Roy Mathew focussed on the need of an inclusive Master Plan

Members were asked to go through the summary and come up with proposals on how to ensure that the College could put into practice the recommendations of the NAAC. It was suggested that members responsible for the various criteria could create Quality Circles under each criteria by including more teachers to discuss the criteria in greater detail and come up with concrete proposals for implementation.
