- 14. Compare and contrast environmental politics in India with the politics of other nations.
- 15. Developing graduates who are capable of understanding communication, expression, and storytelling in a media, organizational, interpersonal and social context.
- 16. Providing students with an understanding of the history, social and cultural roles of media in society, both through courses specifically focused on these topics and by incorporating these themes into other, production-oriented courses.
- 17. Developing in students an aesthetic understanding of media production and technical proficiency in areas such as video and visual production, writing and digital media development.
